The custom-made trophy is now proudly displayed in the trophy case at Lake Hazel Middle School.

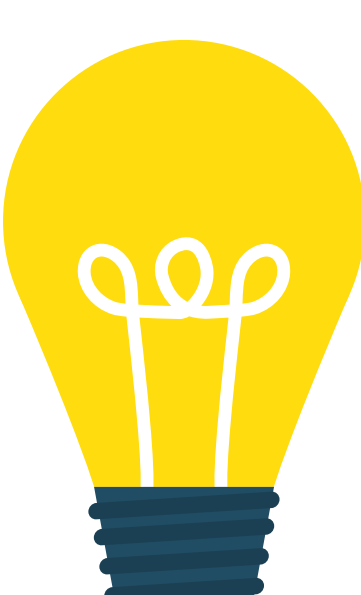
#CrushALZ was a historic team competition in Stall Catchers that ran for a month in 2017.

A total of 29 teams got involved. One of them – Middle School STEM team from Boise, ID (USA).

In 30 days, Middle School STEM team grew from 113 to over 250 students, making the game viral in their school.

Leaders from the start, they crushed their competition and broke records during a pizza party on the last days.
